Student Attitude to School Survey

Every year our students complete an online survey administered by the Department of Education and this normally happens during class time. This survey aims to gain valuable feedback from students in relation to student engagement, wellbeing, teaching and learning. Overall its purpose is to gain an idea of what our students think about our school and their experience to date.

This year this survey will still be conducted, during remote learning time, commencing at the end of next week (August 27th – September 10th). Due to the current situation with COVID-19, some questions have been added to the survey about student health and wellbeing and student perceptions of COVID-19. The aim being that schools and the Department of Education will capture valuable information that will assist in further supporting students in what has been a very disrupted year.

All families will receive a letter from The Department of Education and Training outlining this information in more detail. This should arrive in the post in the coming days. If you have concerns regarding the survey you can email us before Thursday 27^{th} August at Ararat.sc@education.vic.gov.au and ask for your child to opt out. Tips for building resilient families in the coronavirus era.

On Tuesday 25 August, the Department of Education and Training is presenting a free webinar for parents and carers by renowned child psychologist Dr Michael Carr-Gregg, on building family resilience during coronavirus (COVID-19).

Parents and carers play a vital role in helping children feel safe through uncertain times.

- Access school calendar

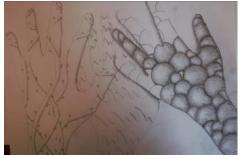

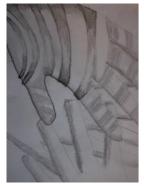






















Lockdown is hard.

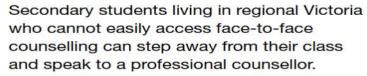
Create a headspace account

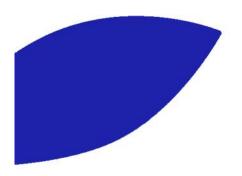


Free headspace counselling in regional schools

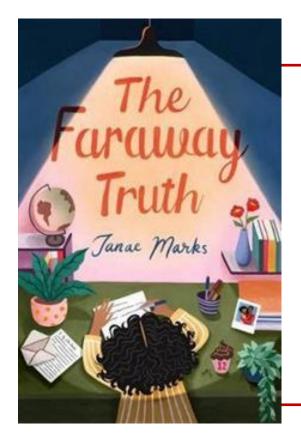

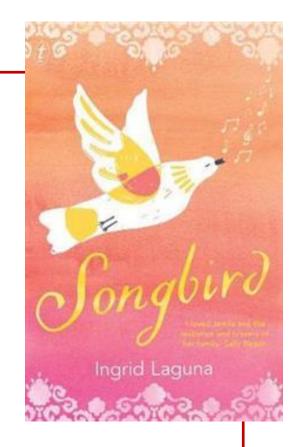


A warm, wise and captivating mystery full of heart, as one girl searches for the truth in the face of great opposition.
