#### **Welcome Back**

I would like to welcome back all of our students and their families as we commence Semester Two. As a staff, we are very thankful that we have been able to continue face to face learning. We will continue to follow the advice released from the Department of Education and the Victorian Chief Health Officer. Currently that is - our school can continue to operate whilst observing the recommended health measures. 




enigmatic bear and a talking whale. The End of the World Is Bigger than Love is unlike anything you've read before.
