Our Year 11 Drama class headed to Melbourne on Wednesday with Miss Anderson and Melissa Fiegert to watch the critically acclaimed production of Billy Elliot The Musical.

The show is listed on the VCAA Drama and Theatre Studies Playlist as an integral part of the VCE curriculum in Year 12. We attended the production to begin building our analysis skills ahead of next year, looking at the production elements in depth as we will do again in Unit 3. Featuring music by Elton John, Billy Elliot the Musical is an extraordinary theatrical experience that has captivated audiences around the world. Seen by over 12 million people worldwide and acclaimed by audiences and critics alike, Billy Elliot is the recipient of over 85 awards internationally.

Set in a northern town during the miners' strike of 1984/5, the show follows Billy's journey from boxing ring to ballet class where he discovers a passion for dance that unites his family, inspires his community and changes his life forever.

We all entered the theatre filled with optimism and were not disappointed. The three hour production made us feel all the emotions of the characters in the narrative and left us amazed at highly technical use of sets. An unforgettable portrayal of Lee Hall's storyline and we can't wait to examine the show further!

Labour Day Long Weekend


Monday March 9th is a public holiday due to Labour Day. I wish all families a safe and relaxing long weekend.






These new novels with a basketball theme are now available to borrow from the library.
