Student Attitude to School Survey

This week our school started our annual Attitude to School Survey. At Ararat College student voice is very important and this survey is a great way for students to provide our school with feedback. We have been talking to students about actively participating in this survey and valuing their opportunity to have a say in the future decisions of the school.

NAPLAN

This year our school is again undertaking NAPLAN online which means the testing will be conducted over a two-week period, beginning May 11th. Tests are spread out over this time so that students are not completing them every day and are only completing one test per day. Students need to ensure that they have a charged laptop during this time. At Ararat College we focus on effort, personal growth and attitude, NAPLAN provides a great opportunity for our students to try their best and then reflect on the growth they have made. It is important that all students sit NAPLAN and experience the test conditions they are likely to experience as they move into the senior years of their education. NAPLAN also provides rich information to our teachers about how they can continue to best support your child through point of need teaching and differentiated tasks.

Attitude to Schools Survey

WE WANT OUR STUDENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing, and quality instruction, and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school.

The AtoSS is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist our school to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, bullying and life in general.

Students from Year 7 - 12 at our school will participate in the survey. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Your child has the right to refuse or withdraw from the survey at any time.

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an <u>assigned identifier</u> that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. All responses to the survey are kept anonymous in the response file. Personal identification data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school over the period Monday 26 April to Friday 11 June The survey takes around 20-45 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time.

The survey results will be reported back to the school in an aggregate form throughout the survey period. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per year level.

News from the School Farm - Grape Harvest

On the last Monday of Term 1, the VCAL students took part in the most important part of their work at the school farm. It was picking and crushing day and the 2^{nd} harvest picked from the school's Commissioners Hill Vineyard since its reintroduction into Ararat College's curriculum in 2018. All students that attended worked exceptionally well knowing how vital this day was to the successful completion of their work on the Vineyard and the production of the school wine 'Commissioners Hill Shiraz'. It was a bumper harvest that saw us picking in the vicinity of 1.5-2 tonne over 2 days. Students picked and crushed the grapes on the same day and pitched the yeast to ensure that the wine making process kicked off. Students were involved in temperature checking and running tests to ensure that the fermentation process was happening properly.















As a result of when the grapes were ready to be picked, and where the school holidays fell, the process of breaking the cap and punching the wine on a daily basis was left to the VCAL staff and their families. On the middle Monday of the school holidays Mr. Briody and Mr. Reynolds (and his family) were joined by Will Maddern and Zaviour Quarrell to transfer the wine into the storage tanks and press off the skins, undoubtedly the messiest job of the process. Thanks to all that helped out with these procedures and the local wineries and wine makers for their guidance and advice during this process. Watch this space as we prepare to sell the 2019 Shiraz in the upcoming weeks, and give updates on the progress of the 2021 vintage. Andrew Reynolds - School Farm Coordinator




CSEF 2021

Applications close 25th June 2021.


Who is eligible?


These novels have recently been shortlisted for the Children's Book Council of Australia Book of the Year Award for Younger Readers.
