If you would also like support accessing your child's report or would like a printed copy please phone the school. The purpose of completing these reports frequently is to ensure that parents are continually informed of their child's progress in regards to school achievement, attitude and effort as consistently as possible. 

Ararat College is committed to child safety (Ministerial Order No. 870) and takes all reasonable steps to ensure that the safety of our students is paramount.

How to read the new Progress Reports

There are **four** components to each Progress Report which are described and pictured below:

- 1. **My Goal:** Your child negotiates a goal they believe they can achieve and is challenged by (in regards to academic assessment) with their teacher. The goal is recorded on the report and reflects the score your child is aiming for in that subject. The goal may change over the course of the year dependent on the student's progress.
- 2. **Achievement Score:** The gold dot indicates your child's achievement score for the subject at that time. Teachers will make an on balance judgement about each student's achievement, informing you and your child about how they are performing in that subject. Over the duration of the subject you will be able to follow the progress of your child's achievement in each subject.
- 3. **Attitude** and **Effort Score:** The dark blue bar shows your child's score for attitude and effort in the subject. Over the year you will be able to follow the progress of your child's attitude and effort in each subject.
- 4. **School's Expected Level of Achievement:** The shaded light blue band across each progress report indicated the expected level of achievement at Ararat College. This is set at 60-80% for every subject and should be used as a guide of our expectations for all students.

Unit 3 and 4 ACHIEVEMENT Scores: It is important to remember when understanding your child's achievement score in any Unit 3 / 4 subject that this is not calculated solely on SAC results, but based on the items listed in the assessment guides. Any scores provided for SACs may change as a part of the VCAA statistical moderation process.



New Ararat College ID Card

All Students will be issued with a new Ararat College ID card before the end of term two.

Students can use their PTV approved school ID to:

- access concession travel on public transport or to purchase a student pass
- Proof of enrolment at Ararat College
- Sign in and out via the Kiosk in College Office using the barcode on reverse side card.

Cards are valid for up to 2 years and must be kept in a safe place.

Replacement cards can be issued with a cash charge of \$3.00.




These two novels for fans of fantasy fiction are new in the library this week.



Morrigan Crow is cursed. Born on an unlucky day, she is blamed for all local misfortunes, from hailstorms to heart attacks - and, worst of all, the curse means that Morrigan is doomed to die at midnight on Eventide. But as Morrigan awaits her fate, a strange and remarkable man named Jupiter North appears. He whisks her away into the safety of a secret, magical city called Nevermoor. It's there that Morrigan discovers Jupiter has chosen her to contend for a place in the city's most prestigious organisation: the Wundrous Society. In order to join, she must compete in four difficult and dangerous trials against hundreds of other children, each boasting an extraordinary talent that sets them apart. Except for Morrigan, who doesn't seem to have any special talent at all. To stay in the safety of Nevermoor for good, Morrigan will need to find a way

to pass the tests - or she'll have to leave the city to confront her deadly fate.

Dreading her first day at a new school, Alex is stunned when she walks through a doorway and finds herself stranded in Medora, a fantasy world full of impossibilities.
