




A C Reads

Remember that you can always request new titles for the library using the forms in the Illuminate cupboard, or by speaking to Miss Jacobs.














Year 7 Music




Year 7 Health

VCAL Remote Learning






Outdoor Education Camp


Our Spiny Leaf Insects Turn 1

Last year in May, we adopted our horde of spiny leaf insects from the breeding program at Horsham College. They turn one later this month and we hope to set up our own breeding program here at Ararat College. Spiny leaf insect eggs take one to three years to hatch, and they reproduce both sexually and the females can reproduce asexually via parthenogenesis. These processes are key components in science and VCE biology and we are proud to have our own living models to study. Thank you to Donna, our lab technician, for the care and maintenance involved in this project.



Year 12 Biology

The year 12 biology class are preparing for their SAC (school assessed coursework) this week which is on photosynthesis. They hypothesised that if the concentration of carbon dioxide increases then the rate of photosynthesis will increase. This was evaluated in this 'prac' by using spinach leaves and varying concentrations of carbon dioxide.
