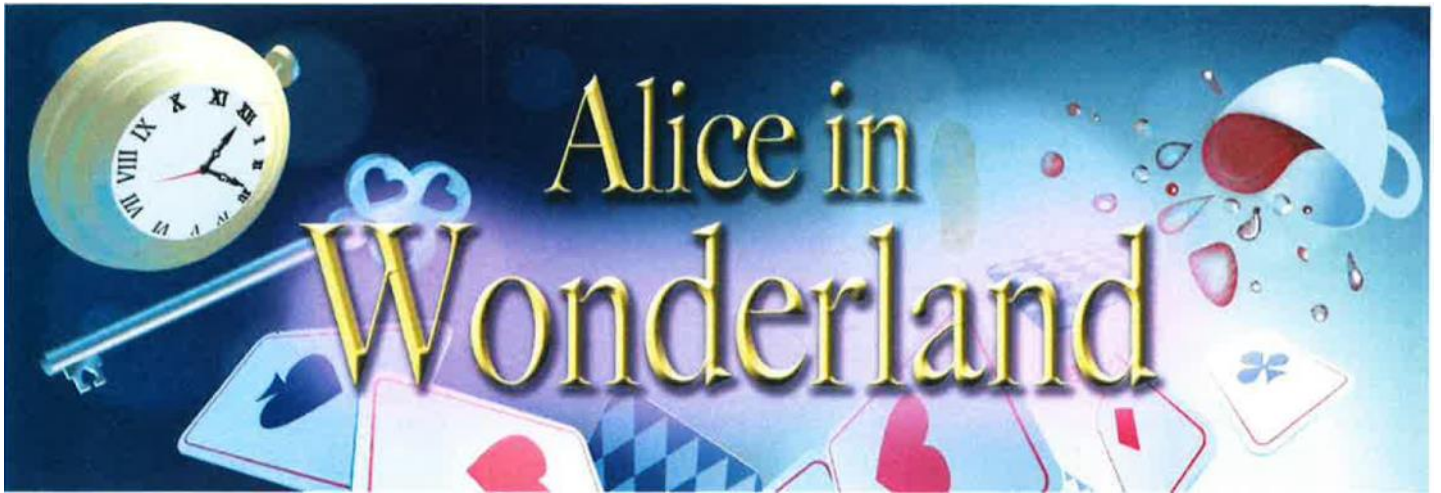
School Production – ‘Alice in Wonderland’
