Remote Learning 2.0

All families should now have received electronic copies of the Remote Learning Parent Handbook and relevant resources, a hard copy package was posted out in the mail on Tuesday. We have made some minor adjustments to the Year 7 & 8 and Year 9 & 10 schedules. These changes were based on feedback from students and parents during our first round of remote learning.

We are focusing on engagement with our remote learning program. It is essential that this time in lockdown is as stress free as possible for families, with any additional pressures minimised or avoided. Throughout this six-week period, our student welfare team will be continuing with telehealth appointments for students and our education support staff will also be providing additional virtual check-ins with students. After numerous attempts to re home him with our Canteen Manager, he would still find his way back to the school each day, so it was decided this should be his home. Students organised fundraisers to provide for all of his veterinary care, and it was through this care it was discovered he had a major hearing impairment.

'Hey Hey' would spend his day during class time sleeping in one of his many sunny spots and at recess and lunchtime being indulged with lots of pats and hugs from students and staff. He loved everyone unconditionally and the importance of this positive interaction with our students cannot be measured or underestimated.

'Hey Hey' has been buried at the school, near one of his favourite spots, close to the canteen. There will be a memorial placed here so that we can remember the positive impact 'Hey Hey' had on our school and the students within.
