## **VET Kitchen Operations**

VET Kitchen Operations Students have been putting their cooking and catering skills into practice by providing a takeaway food service for staff on a Wednesday. With the continued possibility of lockdowns, it is difficult to plan events that give students the opportunity to complete the tasks required for their course.

As part of the training for the Cert II in Kitchen Operations, students are required to complete a minimum of 12 full food services. The requirement for the students is to organise a menu, ask for orders and then produce and provide good quality food. In line with the current regulations, students have been providing take away meals to staff of Ararat College over recent weeks, with more to come. Meals are ordered online with a new menu set each week and prepackaged for collection.

The choices this week were as follows:

- Grilled Chicken Caesar-Style Salad,
- Osso Bucco with Mashed Potato and Roasted Vegetables,
- Lemon Tart with Raspberry Coulis and Whipped Cream,
- Chicken Wings,
- Deep Fried Banana with Vanilla Caramel Sauce,

- Rolled Stuffed Chicken with Seasonal vegetables.



The portal is password protected and secure, and gives parents the ability to:


- View attendance and notify the school of a student absence





### These new novels are now available in the library.
