Alanna Robertson from Mrs Canty's Year 8 English class completed this account of her holiday adventures. Well done Alanna!





Students in Ms Henry's Year 8 Textiles class have been developing their skills on the sewing machine and starting to work on their aprons.




















New Books in the Library


Students have read and recommended these two new novels this week


