
#### The Resilience Project Visit





## **Global Food**







## **News from Technology**








Students in year 7 have been busy making letter holders with a pen holder attached. Everyone has been able to draw their own design and make it the way they designed it.

Students have been working with pine timber and are required to cut, drill, assemble and paint their project. Pictured are students at various stages of their construction.

Year 9/10 electronic class have been learning how to calculate the resistance in resistors by using a chart and maths to find the answer.

They then made some electronic testers with only 2 LED lights, a resistor and some wire. Soldering all the parts and then putting them inside a case of their choice.


## **Luna Park Physics Excursion**




Sixteen-year-old agent Six of Hearts is the first human to be grown from designer DNA.
